Aims/priorities: These are funds available to communities to make their neighbourhoods better places to live. £20,000 of neighbourhood investment funding is available to every area



(ward) in Manchester each year - to help groups carry out events and activities that benefit people in their local neighbourhood.

Who can apply: The fund is open to established groups, voluntary groups and other community groups, as well as groups of residents working together for the first time. School Parent Teacher Associations can also apply if they have the support of local residents and parents and the project benefits the wider community as well as the school.

Grant amount: Applications should not exceed £10,000

Transport for Greater Manchester Cycling Facilities Grant

Aims/priorities: As a part of a wider investment in cycling, Transport for Greater Manchester (TfGM) is offering grants to Charities and Community Interest Companies (CIC's) in



Greater Manchester who wish to install new or improved cycle parking facilities for use by visitors/clients and members of the public. For example, your organisation may want to install cycle parking such as Sheffield stands, covered shelters, lockers and signage.

Installing cycle parking helps make travelling by bike a more viable option, providing somewhere secure and convenient to lock up and keep cycles safe. It also sends a strong positive message to visitors and clients that they encourage and promote active, healthy and sustainable travel.

CHILDREN & YOUNG PEOPLE

Paul Hamlyn - The Youth Fund

Aims/priorities: The Youth Fund supports organisations whose main purpose is about helping young people (aged 14-25) in the most precarious positions, where making the



transition to adult independence is most challenging. The Fund supports organisations which work with young people experiencing disadvantage in a way that recognises and builds on their strengths and potential – we refer to this as an asset-based approach. Such approaches can include 'strengths-based', 'advantaged thinking', or 'asset-based community development' practices. The Fund will provide core funding to organisations within the youth sector and outside. We will pay for core operating costs to help grow an organisation's impact. Examples of things you might put the money towards include:

- Part-fund the salary of a key individual, whether the Chief Executive or a post such as a Head of Operations/Finance
- Policy work
- Additional fundraising or income generation capacity
- Upgrading IT systems or website to reach young people online
- Installing a new database to capture data on the organisation's impact
- Staff training or development
- · Running costs such as utilities and other bills
- We will not fund project based activity (e.g. a project worker, activities for young people) unless it has the scope for wider impact beyond the immediate beneficiaries.

Who can apply: We welcome applications from organisations who meet the following criteria:

- Not-for-profit
- Work in the UK
- Work at either local, regional or national levels, or at more than one level
- Provide direct services and/or second-tier support
- Whose main purpose is about supporting young people (aged 14-25).

Grant amount: Between £10,000 and £60,000 in total

Children in Need Small Grants

Aims/priorities: Children in Need funds projects aimed at children and young people of 18 years and under experiencing disadvantage through:



- Illness, distress, abuse or neglect
- Any kind of disability
- Behavioural or psychological difficulties
- Living in poverty or situations of deprivation

Projects they fund make a difference in children's lives and help prevent or overcome the effects of the disadvantages they face. Projects achieve these differences by either working directly with children or seeking to improve their social and physical environments.

Who can apply: Not-for-profit organisations that work with disadvantaged children and young people of 18 years and under who live in the UK, the Isle of Man or the Channel Islands.

Grant amount: Up to £10,000 **Deadline:** 1 December 2016

Carriers for Causes

Aims/priorities: Carriers for Causes grants are available for good causes within two miles of a One Stop shop. Grants, of up to £1000 will be available to support projects that 'benefit local communities - helping to improve lives and local places'. The types of projects funded will be very broad and will cover the direct costs needed to deliver the project, this could be buying litter pickers and



bags for a community cleanup days, plants, spades and forks to plant up a new community garden, the cost of a minibus for a day trip for a community group or the materials needed to paint a room at the local hospice. One Stop's 'Carriers for Causes' is funded through the money raised from the 5p bag charge in One Stop stores in England, Wales and Scotland.

Who can apply: Projects need to be within 2 miles of a participating One Stop store. Registered Charities and not for profit organisations can apply.

The Bernard Sunley Charitable Foundation

Aims/priorities: Our grants are divided into the following categories. Please click on the link for more information as to whether your project qualifies:

There is a preference to support capital projects (i.e. new build, refurbishment and improvements) rather than small, non-durable items subject to wear and tear such as furniture, appliances, musical instruments and tablets/laptops.

Who can apply: Applicants must be charities registered with the Charity Commission for England and Wales.

Grant amount: There are three levels of grant:

- Small £1,000 to £5,000
- Medium £5,001 to £24,999
- Large £25,000 or more

Projects with a total budget of under £3,000 should not apply.

Deadline: There are no formal application deadlines. The Trustees meet on a regular basis. We accept applications via our online form all year round.

Awards for All

Aims/priorities: The Lottery's Awards for All offers grants for grassroots and community activity that aims to improve life for local people and neighbourhoods. It is our most popular grants programme so we will prioritise groups with smaller incomes. Due to high demand on the programme, organisations that have a large annual income may



not be able to get funding through Awards for All. You project must meets at least one of the following to be considered for a grant.

- People have better chances in life with better access to training and development to improve life skills
- Stronger communities with more active citizens working together to tackle issues within the community
- Improved rural and urban environments which communities are able to better access and enjoy
- Healthier and more active people and communities

Who can apply: Community groups or not-for-profit groups can apply. You do not need to be a registered charity to apply. You must have a bank account that requires at least two people to sign each cheque or withdrawal.

Grant amount: Between £300 and £10,000

Deadline: It doesn't have a deadline and you can apply at any time

Application Process: Download the application form and fill in. You can either fill in the form and

email back or post the form.

The Baring Foundation

Who can apply: The Baring Foundation's, Strengthening the Voluntary Sector programme supports effective use of the law and human rights



based approaches by the voluntary sector in the United Kingdom to tackle discrimination and disadvantage. It is a collaboration with The Legal Education Foundation and The Esmée Fairbairn Foundation.

Funding is available through two open pilot funds:

- training, education and capacity building seed funding grants of up to £30,000 over six months to two years that support organisations to understand how their objectives can be achieved through use of the law or human rights based approaches.
- applied projects grants of up to £150,000 over approximately three years to create new
 capacity for work that addresses specific discrimination or disadvantage and safeguards the
 freedom of purpose, action and voice of the sector, linking the skills of 'non-legal' and 'legal'
 organisations to enhance and complement campaigns for social change. Organisations will

be expected to demonstrate innovative approaches to using these tools and evidence of how they will collaborate to support a shared agenda.

Grant amount: Seed funding grants of up to £30,000 or grants of up to £150,000.

The WHSmith Trust Community Grant

Aims/priorities: With the introduction of the new WHSmith Community Grants, the WHSmith Trust is now offering grants to voluntary organisations from the proceeds of the compulsory carrier bag levies across the UK. Grants are awarded every six months to charities and community groups of any size, provided they support the community in the UK.



Who can apply: Registered or Exempt Charities and Voluntary and Community Group who are constituted.

The Triangle Trust 1949 Fund

Aims/priorities:

The Triangle Trust wants to fund organisations that are set up to support the rehabilitation of offenders or ex-offenders. (Organisations with a broader remit running a project to support the rehabilitation of offenders or ex-offenders are not eligible to apply).



The Triangle Trust recognises in the current economic climate, building a solid foundation for longterm sustainability for your organisation can be of higher importance than starting a new project. We therefore offer Development Grants to provide funds towards your organisation's core costs. We would like to see applicants use these grants to develop sustainable income sources, so that when our grant comes to end your organisation's income will not be reduced.
